

EXTRAORDINARY GENERAL MEETING OF THE CONGREGATION

To be held after morning worship on Sunday 25th August 2024 in the Church

An Extraordinary General Meeting of the Congregation will be held after morning worship on Sunday 25th August 2024 in the Church.

The purpose of the meeting is to receive a unanimous recommendation from the Joint Nominating Committee to issue a call to a Minister to become the next Minister of Toorak Uniting Church. The recommendation has been enthusiastically approved by the Pastoral Relations Committee of the Presbytery.

The Joint Nominating Committee will make a presentation to the congregation about the Minister recommended to be called.

A vote on the recommendation, which to be carried requires a two-thirds majority of those present and voting, will then be held by secret ballot.
